## Who is VOICE?

VOICE (Virginians Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement) is a non-partisan citizens' organization of almost 50 faith and civic institutions in Northern Virginia. We organize to build power and do justice in middle and low-income communities in Fairfax, Prince William, Arlington and Alexandria City. Uniting people across lines of race, class, religion, political party and geography, we take action on key issues in our communities including, but not limited to, immigrant rights, foreclosure accountability, schools, criminal justice, affordable housing preservation/ development, and youth investment.

Founded in 2008, VOICE is an independent and non-profit organization led by a strategy team of religious, lay, and community leaders from across Northern Virginia. VOICE is funded by dues-paying member institutions (congregations, temples, mosques, union locals, business groups, schools, health centers, etc.), grants from foundations, and generous donations from individuals and businesses.

VOICE is affiliated with the Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF), the nation's first and largest network of multifaith broad-based citizen organizations, which has seven decades of experience winning tough battles on housing, health care, education, living wages, immigrant rights and other issues across the nation.

## VISION

We believe that people working together have the power to change their communities and their country for the better.

## NEED

Political and corporate leaders often don't embrace change unless they're pressured by the people they serve. And too many people don't realize they have the potential to join forces and create change in their neighborhoods through organizing.

## OUR APPROACH

We work with the people who want to transform the world—from what it is to what they believe it should be. We challenge people to imagine the change they can accomplish, connect individuals and organizations to multiply their power, and organize people by the hundreds and thousands to make their voices heard. We set bold goals, we create effective strategies—and we ACT, taking on the powerful interests that stand in the way.

## 2008–16 VOICE Signature Victories

**Held the CEOs from Bank of America, JP Morgan Chase, and General Electric accountable for the foreclosure crisis** in Prince William County, VA — resulting in \$250 million in principal reduction, more than 1,500 loan modifications, and \$30 million in reinvestment capital that kept thousands of families from losing their homes and is rebuilding blighted communities

**Won \$800,000 to provide dental care to over 2,000 low-income adults** in Northern Virginia and preserved \$9 million in state funding for dental care for low-income families statewide

**Trained and organized hundreds of immigrant leaders to win** on local housing, recreation, youth investment and immigration issues as well as to be a voice on national comprehensive and accountable immigration reform

**Developed major power base of multi-faith institutions to support Muslims from hate and anti-immigrant based attacks**

**Organized low-income tenants to preserve 1,000+ affordable apartments and public housing units** from upscale development in Alexandria, Arlington, and Fairfax counties, to address housing and fire code violations improving 2,000+ units in Fairfax, Prince William, and Alexandria, and to win 1,000+ new affordable housing units on public and non-profit owned land in Northern Virginia

**Secured \$3 million to renovate local parks and athletic facilities** for low-income African-American and immigrant residents in southern Fairfax County

**Organized \$200,000+ in member dues each year (2008-2016) from 45 member institutions** to support VOICE's Northern Virginia organizing and to insure its non-partisan, political independence

**Won \$10 million to expand pre-kindergarten to serve 576 low-income children** in Prince William County, VA—the first majority-minority county in Virginia



## Member Organizations, Leadership & Staff

VOICE is governed by 1) a Strategy Team of clergy and lay leaders which sets the strategic direction for the organization and 2) an Action Team of 100+ leaders from the member institutions (2 votes per institution) that discuss, ratify, and implement all VOICE's major campaigns and actions. There are approximately 4-6 Action Team Meetings a year.

# 2016 Summary of Accomplishments



In the last year alone, VOICE has **trained 500 ordinary citizens** in the proven person-to-person organizing method that VOICE & our sister affiliates around the country have used for more than 70 years. Because of our success and proven track record, **VOICE Won the 2016 Governor's Volunteerism and Community Service Award.**

Additionally, in front of 1,100 VOICE leaders from 65+ institutions, **Attorney General Herring committed to work with VOICE to curb gun violence:** **a)** Use the power of his office to go after the gun dealers that are the major source of guns used in crimes & **b)** Join 105+ other government entities to compel gun manufacturers to produce "smart" guns.

## 2016 Summary of Accomplishments: **Alexandria**

**VOICE ALEXANDRIA** leaders organized to secure final approval for the Ramsey Public Housing Redevelopment that will redevelop and preserve the 15 public housing units for very low-income Alexandria residents plus adding 38 new affordable units. In addition, Ramsey residents and VOICE leaders conducted housing code violations inspections of all the Ramsey homes. ARHA completed the work and/or addressed all issues found during the inspection, within 30 days.

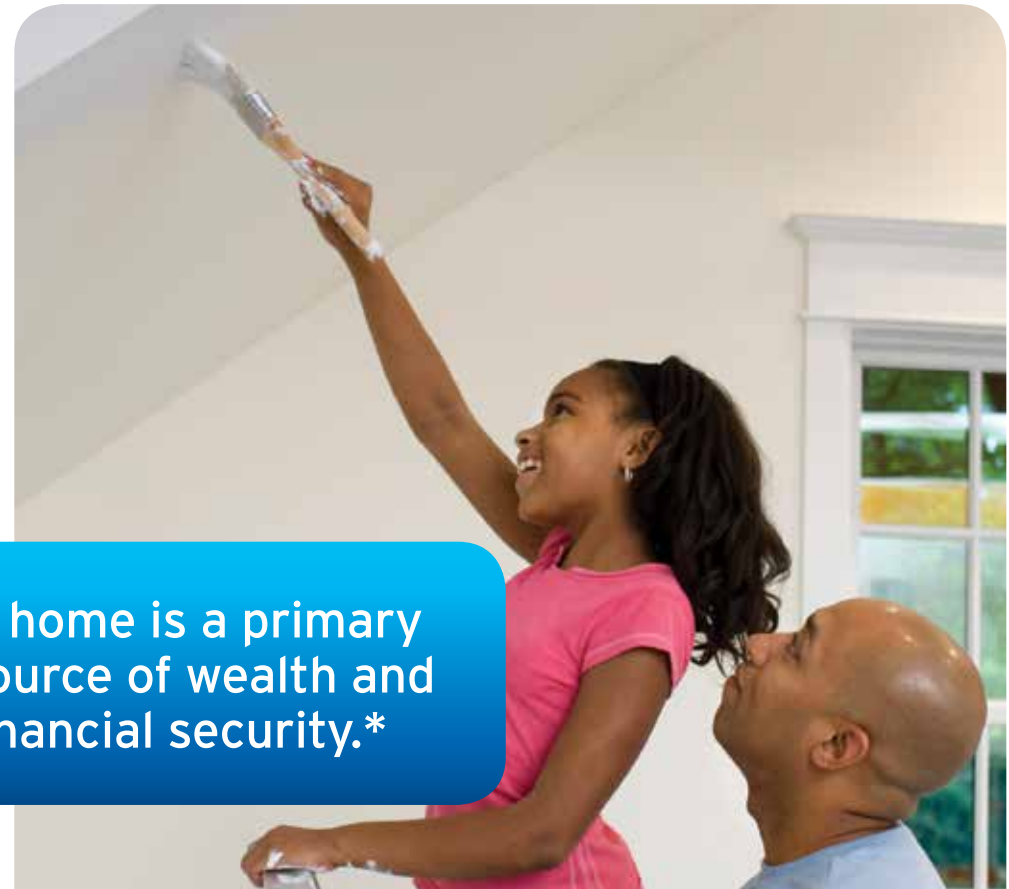

## 2016 Summary of Accomplishments:

# Arlington

**VOICE ARLINGTON** continued to be central to ensuring big wins for affordable housing, including a \$1.2 million increase to \$13.7 million for the Affordable Housing Investment Fund, plus AHIF financing to make sure 68 endangered market-rate units remain affordable in Westover. VOICE also is organizing to demand the County meet its 2,500-unit goal along Lee Highway.

In addition, they celebrated four new members and discerning members—Muslim American Society, Floris United Methodist Church, Vienna Baptist & Burke Presbyterian.

## 2016 Summary of Accomplishments:

# Prince William Area

**VOICE PRINCE WILLIAM** enjoyed further expansion of preschool for a total of 11 classrooms of full day pre-K for low-income 4-year-olds. VOICE leaders publicly denounced Chairman Corey Stewart's anti-immigrant rhetoric. In addition, they moved Prince William County Sheriff Hill to write a letter to gun manufacturers as part of VOICE's parent organization's national campaign to curb gun violence.

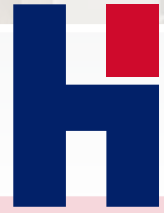

## VOICE FINANCES | 2015 Audit Summary

VOICE is funded by dues from member organizations and donations from individuals, religious institutions, businesses, and foundations. The current \$501,500 annual budget pays four professional organizers who guide and serve the member organizations on making change on community issues that members have identified. The budget also funds the training of over 250 volunteers each year and covers expenses associated with operating several issue campaigns. VOICE does not accept government funds so that it can remain autonomous and politically independent and non-partisan. VOICE is a tax-exempt non-profit organization under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Code and is a registered charitable organization with the Commonwealth of Virginia. VOICE completes an audit and files IRS Form 990 annually, copies of which may be obtained upon request. VOICE's 2016 audit will be available in September 2017.
